

## Groundwork Denver Green Team Supervisor Job Description

Groundwork Denver is looking for a leader to supervise, mentor, and coordinate our Summer Northeast Denver Green Team Program.

### Groundwork Denver Overview

Groundwork Denver is a 501c(3) non-profit organization located in Denver, CO. The mission of *Groundwork Denver* is to bring about the sustained improvement of the environment and promote health and well-being through community-based partnerships and action. We are “doers”, not “talkers”. We plant trees, we improve parks, we clean up rivers, we grow food, we insulate houses, and we coordinate thousands of volunteers to help.

### Green Team Overview

The Green Team is a summer employment program for youth ages 13 to 18-years old. Participants will work on projects focused on improving the physical environment and health and well-being for the Denver Metropolitan Area, as well as our public lands, including local and national forest, parks and refuges. Past projects have included helping with community gardens, area waterways, city parks and open spaces, community events, tree plantings, neighborhood beautification, connecting residents with resources, habitat restoration and more. Green Team Supervisors must take part in a 4-day **supervisor training May 16<sup>th</sup> – May 19<sup>th</sup>** which includes an overnight trip to Woodbine Ecology Center the nights of May 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>. Supervisors are expected to work **approximately 25 hours per week**, from approximately **June 4<sup>th</sup> to July 26<sup>th</sup>**, leading, coordinating and supervising improvement projects, community engagement activities, job skills training and leadership development. Green Teams will also go on at least **two mandatory overnight camping trips** during the summer and are expected to participate in team-building outdoor recreation activities.

### Responsibilities:

#### Leadership and Mentorship

- Manage, supervise, coordinate, and participate in day-to-day organization of team members and projects.
- Implement skills and trainings and facilitate intentional discussion via informal lessons to contribute to team members' personal growth and group dynamics.
- Promote a healthy community and individual member development.
- Lead by example by demonstrating hard work ethic and environmental results.
- Drive the rental 12-15 passenger van (if over 25), organize tools and food and lead camp life culture when camping.

#### Safety and Risk Management

- Monitor and promote the crew's physical and emotional safety on and off the work site.
- Lead teams safely on proper use of tools.
- Follow Groundwork Denver safety procedures, including informing appropriate staff of incidents and concerns.
- Complete all required supervisor trainings including CPR/First Aid, Mandatory Reporting, and Driver Safety.

#### Project Management and Implementation

- Train and motivate team to complete environmental projects in cooperation with partners and host sites.
- Coordinate project logistics with Program Director and other project leaders.
- Connect with community partners to plan and implement projects which align with Groundwork Denver's mission.

#### Administration

- Complete documentation of timesheets, daily and weekly reports, evaluation, incident reports, etc.
- Manage petty cash, gas cards, and food budget.

- Participate in hiring and evaluation, in cooperation with Program Director.
- Coordinate with Project leads and Program Director via email, text, phone calls, and leadership meetings.

### Qualifications:

Supervisors are required to meet all Green Team member qualifications (please see Green Team Job Description), in addition to:

- Ability to supervise and teach tasks
- Willingness to implement safety and management regulations
- Skills in organization, leading youth and guiding individuals
- Skills in project coordination and facilitation
- Must be comfortable doing outdoor physical labor
- Must be able to speak, understand, read and write English (Bi-lingual Spanish preferred)
- Must be able to pass a Criminal Background check

### Work Schedule

- May 16<sup>th</sup> – 19<sup>th</sup>: Supervisor Training (May 17<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup> overnight @ Woodbine Ecology Center)
- June 4<sup>th</sup> – June 6<sup>th</sup>: Overnight (2 nights) orientation @ Woodbine Ecology Center (transportation provided)
- June 10<sup>th</sup> – July 26<sup>th</sup>: 4 days of work per week, up to 25 hours per week, with some exceptions around the 4<sup>th</sup> of July holiday and overnight camping trips.
- Additional work opportunities may include: traveling to Grand Teton National Park to work, meeting park staff and connecting with the Groundwork USA national network, and participating in other work opportunities as they arise during and after the summer season.

### Green Team Work Overview

Green Team work projects generally consist of the following:

- Healthy Eating Active Living (HEAL): garden building, weeding, planting, harvesting, participating in farmers markets, encouraging healthy habits.
- Environmental Resource Management: Public Park, Forest, and Wildlife Refuge maintenance, trail work, tree planting, water stewardship, invasive species removal, and advocating for healthy environments.
- Community Engagement: Helping with outreach and implementation of neighborhood events, door-to-door outreach connecting residents with helpful resources and information, giving public feedback regarding neighborhood amenities, seeking out community feedback regarding environmental challenges, and presenting to community members and representatives about your experience.

**\*Substance Free**– In accordance to a drug-free workplace, alcohol, tobacco, and drugs are prohibited in and around the Groundwork workplace.

### Wage

- \$16.00-18.00/hr. Up to 250 hours
- This is a contract position. Workers compensation is provided for all Supervisors and youth.
